

City of Wayland Park Rules



General Park Rules for all City Parks:

- Hunting is not permitted in any City of Wayland Park.
- Parks are open from dawn to dusk. City of Wayland’s “No Trespassing” ordinance will be enforced after the park is closed.
- No motorized vehicles are allowed in City Parks.
- Alcohol is not permitted in City Parks.
- The use of designated park facilities (gazebos & shelters) must be reserved through City Hall by fulfilling all application requirements.
- No person shall cut, remove or destroy any plants (alive or dead).
- No fires are permitted outside of designated cooking grills.
- Fishing is permitted in accordance with the laws of the Department of Natural Resources of the State of Michigan in such areas designated for such purposes.
- No person shall fire, discharge or have in his/her possession any firecracker, rocket, sparkler, or other fireworks or any substance of an explosive or dangerous nature.
- Pets shall be kept on a leash no greater than six feet in length and or under the immediate and continuous control of a competent person and shall not be allowed to disturb or annoy park users.

Skateboard Park:

Skateboarding, skating and freestyle Biking can be hazardous recreational activities. Skate at your own risk. The City of Wayland does not assume any responsibility for loss or injury. This is a non-supervised facility.

- Protective equipment should be used at all times. Use of this facility may expose the user to serious injury including broken bones, paralysis or heat exhaustion. Helmets, elbow pads, kneepads, and wrist guards are strongly recommended and encouraged.
- Park will not be open during inclement weather.
- The following are not permitted in the Skate Plaza: drugs of any kind, alcoholic beverages, reckless behavior, smoking/tobacco products, fighting, profanity, graffiti, excessively loud music, glass containers, motorized vehicles, food/beverages or pets.
- Obstacles, ramps, other equipment or materials are not permitted to be added or altered.
- The City of Wayland, reserves the right to restrict entry to the facility and ask persons to leave as a result of disorderly conduct, disturbance of the peace, violations or unsafe behavior. Any person not complying with these rules will not be permitted to use the facility.
